Mental Health Screening Tools FOR THE HIV CLINICIAN

This webinar will review common psychiatric disorders in HIV, and relevant screening tools will be discussed. Clinicians working with HIV+ patients often need to address mental health needs, especially in situations where there is a lack of psychiatric specialty care available. Screening tools are available to help the clinician screen for a variety of mental health conditions, including cognitive dysfunction, mood/anxiety disorders, and substance abuse. Some commonly used screening tools may not be useful or appropriate for the patient living with HIV/AIDS.

- Describe how HIV affects the brain.
- Identify mental disorders that are common among patients with HIV/AIDS.
- Identify which screening tools should be considered for HIV+ patients.
